ATPIO PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

1. WEBINARS:

ATPIO is committed to organize continuing education activities, such as webinars on contemporary transportation related topics. These webinars will be free and open to members and friends of ATPIO. One hour PDH certificates will be available to attendees. ATPIO's goal is to organize a minimum of two webinars per year.

2. MENTOR-PROTÉGÉ PROGRAMS:

ATPIO has the following two distinct Mentor-Protégé programs:

2.a. Mentor-Protégé Program for Professionals

This program is intended to provide guidance to professionals of Indian origin in the early years of their career. ATPIO will identify and arrange for Mentor suitable for each selected Protégé and monitor mentoring process to assure its success.

By March 31st each year, interested individuals will send an email request to ATPIO Secretary (<u>atpio.secretary@gmail.com</u>) accompanied by a resume' and contact information. By May 15 each year, ATPIO Mentor-Protégé Committee will select up to five candidates to participate in the program, identify suitable mentors for each selected protégé and announce its decision. Typical duration for mentor-protégé interaction will be one year.

2.b. Mentor-Protégé Program for Students

This program is intended to provide guidance to students of Indian origin entering into final year of their transportation related undergraduate study at an accredited academic institution in India or in U.S. ATPIO will identify and arrange for Mentor appropriate for each selected Protégé and monitor mentoring process to assure its success.

By March 31st each year, interested individuals will need to send an email request to ATPIO Secretary (<u>atpio.secretary@gmail.com</u>) accompanied by a resume', college transcripts and contact information. By May 15 each year, ATPIO Mentor-Protégé Committee will select up to five candidates to participate in this program, identify suitable mentors for each selected protégé and announce its decision. Duration for mentor- protégé interaction will be one year.

Student applicants for this program shall have a grade point average of 3.00 or greater on a scale of 4.00.
